Budget underwhelms

The recent State Budget has underwhelmed Tasmanian voters, according to an exclusive poll undertaken by Enterprise Marketing and Research Services (EMRS).

The statewide poll of 500 Tasmanians found that nearly half of all respondents (45 per cent) thought that the budget was bad for Tasmania, compared to just over a fifth (22 per cent) who thought it was good.

When asked whether the budget would leave them better or worse off, a total of 38 per cent indicated that it would leave them worse off, compared to just six per cent better off.

Respondents were also asked how they felt key issues were addressed in the budget:

COST OF LIVING: 63% total unsatisfied, 11% total satisfied. HEALTH: 61% total unsatisfied, 21% satisfied HOUSING: 61% total unsatisfied, 16% satisfied DEBT: 62% total unsatisfied, 11% satisfied

Asked to nominate three (unprompted) words to best describe the budget, the most common responses were "debt" (44 times), "irresponsible" (43) and "poor" (28).

The poll also asked respondents their current state voting intention, finding 28 per cent Liberal support, 26 per cent Labor, 17 per cent Green, 5 per cent JLN, 1 per cent another minor party, and 8 per cent unsure/prefer not to say.

"The recent state budget was clearly very unpopular with voters, with nearly half of all respondents saying that they believe the budget is bad for Tasmania", EMRS Acting General Manager Ken Drake said.

"It is notable that the word most associated with the budget is "debt", an issue that the Government has taken a lot of criticism over in this budget."

Mr Drake stressed that while the voting intention numbers are not directly comparable to the regular EMRS Omnibus given the nature of this poll, some observations can be reasonably drawn.

"These numbers would tend to suggest that while the Liberal vote has declined markedly since the election, Labor has yet to capitalise on this", Mr Drake concluded.

*This poll was undertaken from 2-11 October via EMRS' Tasmanian Community Online Panel. Results have been weighted to age, gender, region and past vote to provide a margin of error of 4.38 per cent. The poll was commissioned by EMRS.
