EMRS State Voting Intentions Poll – February 2025 REPORT VERSION: 2

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The survey was conducted from the 11th to the 18th of February 2025.

1,000 Tasmanian registered voters were interviewed, and responses weighted to reflect the Tasmanian adult voting population. A sample of this size provides a maximum margin of error of \pm 3.1 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

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
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TASMANIAN STATE VOTING INTENTIONS





Summary:


After excluding undecided voters:

- Support for the Liberal State Government stands at 34 per cent, down 1 point since the previous poll in November 2024.
- Support for Labor stands at 30 per cent, also down 1 point since the previous poll in November 2024.
- The Greens currently stand at 13 per cent, down 1 point since November 2024.
- Support for the Jacqui Lambie Network (JLN) increased by 2 points since November 2024, currently standing at 8 per cent.
- Support for an independent has increased by 1 point since November 2024, currently standing at 12 per cent.

The proportion of voters stating a preference for Jeremy Rockliff as Preferred Premier has increased by 1pt to 44 per cent in February 2025.

The proportion of voters nominating Dean Winter as preferred premier stands at 34 per cent, down 3pts from 37 per cent in November 2024.

The proportion of voters indicating they were unsure rose by 2pts to 21% in February 2025 from 19% in November 2024.

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A new question regarding the favourability of public figures was added in the November 2024 Omnibus and was asked again in February 2025. This measured the favourability of the major party leaders, Jeremy Rockliff and Dean Winter.

Respondents were asked how favourable they were of each person on a scale of 0 to 10 where 0 is very unfavourable and 10 is very favourable. respondents could also indicate if they were not aware of the name.

Both leaders received positive net favourability ratings.


Over a quarter (27%) indicated that they had not heard of Dean Winter, and a further 10% indicated that while they had heard of Mr. Winter, they didn't feel they knew enough to give an accurate rating.

Respondents in the south (23%) gave Dean Winter a favourable rating compared to those in the combined north and north west (12%).

Those in the combined north and north west (38%) were more likely to say they had never heard of Dean Winter.


Favourability – Leaders
